Bill C-7 Time Sensitive

Action is needed urgently! The Supreme Court of Quebec ruled that Bill C-7 must be passed by the federal government by February 26, 2021. The Bill was forwarded to the Senate of Canada and having reviewed it, sent it back with two amendments to the House of Commons on February 17th. The amendments were passed by a vote of 66 to 19 with three abstentions.

The two amendments are:

- 1. To allow people who fear losing mental capacity to make advance requests for assisted death. (eg. Dementia)
- 2. To impose an 18-month time limit on the bill's proposed blanket ban on assisted dying for people suffering solely from mental illness.

Justice Minister David Lametti also is not ruling out the possibility of asking the Supreme Court to advise the government on the constitutionality of Bill C -7. He believes it will be challenged in court.
